




## A Day in the Life of

## Letter from the Chairman



For more than a century, The New York Public Library has thrived thanks to the enduring public-private partnership crafted by Andrew Carnegie. I am proud that in 2007, support for the Library rose substantially on both sides of this equation: the City increased funding for our operations by \$20.1 million, allowing us to restore six-day service for the first time since 2001, while private donors contributed record support to our Annual Fund for basic operations.

This extraordinary support by government leaders and private donors reflects an appreciation that The New York Public Library serves a vitally important function in our city—connecting people to the knowledge they need to attain their personal goals. The photo essay that begins this Annual Report illustrates the enormous range of connections that are made every day throughout the Library system. It is no wonder that demand for The New York Public Library continues to rise. In fact, in-person visits to the Library increased by almost two million in 2007, while online visits went up by more than five million!

The restoration of six-day service—made possible by Mayor Michael R. Bloomberg, City Council Speaker Christine C. Quinn, and the members of the entire City Council—has already had an immediate impact in meeting the increased need for the Library. But we are very mindful of looking to the future needs of the city, with its ever-changing population.

With this in mind, the Board spent a great deal of 2007 studying the Library itself: its users, collections, services, and facilities. This effort was led by Trustees Roger Hertog and Josh Steiner, who chaired an ad-hoc committee comprising

the leadership of all Board committees, the Chairmen Emeriti, myself, and the executive staff—its goal was to create a strategy to ensure that the Library is prepared for the changes and challenges it faces in the years, and even decades, ahead.

This intense planning process culminated in a far-reaching strategic plan that will bring major changes to our facilities and our digital infrastructure. Our goal is to create an urban public library system that is agile and responsive to the rapidly changing world. The exciting details of our strategy will be announced in the months ahead, and the Board and staff are united in their determination to make The New York Public Library stronger and more effective for generations to come.

Securing the Library's financial future is a prerequisite for implementing our strategy. The current Board has done wonderful work in financial planning and oversight, as evidenced by the extraordinary growth in our endowment, which now exceeds \$800 million—this level was achieved in large part through the work of our Investment Committee, chaired by Kevin Kennedy, and our Budget Committee, led by Sam Butler. We are also fortunate to have in Ed Wachenheim a passionate and committed leader for our upcoming fundraising campaign.

This year, our Board grew through the addition of two distinguished Trustees: Timothy Barakett, the Chairman and CEO of Atticus Capital, and Sila Calderón, a former governor of Puerto Rico. I am also pleased to announce that Josh Steiner has been elected to the newly created position of Vice Chairman of the Board.


As I begin my fourth year as Chairman, I do so with these thoughts proudly in mind:

- First, the Library is strong and dynamic, with a clear sense of where it is going and what it wants to accomplish.
- Second, the Library is truly needed by, and appreciated by, all of the diverse communities it serves and deserves broad public and private support.
- Third, our Board is unified behind our strategy and fully engaged in supporting and promoting the Library as one of the City's essential resources.
- And finally, we recognize that the Library's staff is one of our greatest strengths.

On behalf of the Board, I am grateful to all those who supported the Library in 2007, and I look forward to all we can accomplish together in the year ahead.

### Letter from the President



The announcement that New York City's funding for six-day library service would be restored was a magnificent way to end the 2007 fiscal year, and we wasted no time in implementing the new level of service—beginning in July, every one of The New York Public Library's 89 locations was open Monday through Saturday.

One of our main goals for 2008 is further expansion of hours, and as of this writing, we have tested a new service model in the Bronx that allows us to add more evening hours to 11 branches, and keeps the Bronx Library Center open seven days a week, 12 hours a day. As a result, visits to those libraries have increased by an astounding 21%! By the close of the 2008 fiscal year, we will expand hours in Staten Island and Manhattan as well.

The immediate success of this new model provides vivid evidence that the services offered by The New York Public Library are needed more than ever. In a world in which the Internet and globalization have had such profound effects, free access to knowledge is critical to New Yorkers, and it is our mission to provide it to as many people as possible.

Expanding hours is just one way to reach more people. Our facilities must also be welcoming and safe places, hospitable for all users from toddlers through seniors. Currently, more than \$200 million in much-needed capital improvements are under way in our libraries. In 2007, we completed several major building projects, most notably an \$11 million renovation of the Schomburg Center for Research in Black Culture, whose centerpiece is a new scholars-in-residence center and

a stunning new reading room and exhibition galleries. We also opened two new libraries, the Morris Park Branch in the Bronx, and the Mulberry Street Branch in Manhattan, a beautifully designed facility in the heart of historic SoHo.

Nowadays, our readers are as likely to use a computer as they are to read a book. Many people bring their laptops to the library, and in 2007, we realized our goal of free Wi-Fi access in every single branch library.

Adding to our research collections continues to be a top priority, and this year we acquired several archives of great historic value, including those of the pioneering composer, director, and choreographer Meredith Monk; the Barbara Gittings and Kay Tobin Lahusen Gay History Papers and Photographs, which document the decades-long struggle for gay and lesbian civil rights; and the magnificent publishers' archive of *The New York Times*, which dates back to 1851.

All these accomplishments and more would not have happened without the tremendous support of funders in the public and private sectors, the guidance provided by our Board of Trustees and its Chairman, Catherine C. Marron, and the extraordinary dedication and talent of our staff. All of us who care so deeply about The New York Public Library share a belief in the critical importance of the work we do, and the impact we have on the lives of those we serve: more than 16 million visitors on site and 25 million users online.

No one was more passionate about the Library's mission than Brooke Astor, who, as most of you know, passed away in August. Sadly, this annual report will be the last to list her name at the top of our Board of Trustees. Mrs. Astor joined the Board in 1959, and held the position of Honorary Chairman from 1974 until her death, signaling the very special place she occupied. Her enormous generosity toward The New York Public Library, and her tireless promotion of its welfare, played a crucial part in transforming it into the hugely successful library it is today.



Chag-Yig. Painted images in color and black umai script on yellow silk with 18th-century brocade border, dating to the 8th year of the current (14th) Dalai Lama (i.e., 1944), with his seal. This official Tibetan state document commemorates the many years of service of the then Regent, who governed Tibet until the present Dalai Lama assumed his formal position, and the founding of Thomsaling Monastery, founded by the tutor to the 10th Dalai Lama.

Sir William Chambers. Designs of Chinese Buildings, Furniture, Dresses, Machines, and Utensils. London, 1757.

Newari accordion-fold manuscript with painting. Painting and Sanskrit language in Newari script, with painting in color of various Hindu deities, 19th century.

# Henry W. and Albert A. Berg Collection of English and American Literature

Saul Bellow. 14 unpublished, signed letters, both autograph and typed, to a close Chicago friend, Louis Lasco, 1973–82 and 1990–91, along with an unpublished letter from Bellow's secretary to Lasco. In these letters, comprising 25 pages, Bellow expresses affection for Lasco and discusses their friendship, the characters and fates of mutual friends, wives, sex, old age, illness, and death, and analyzes his own and Lasco's personalities. In the letters from the 1970s and 1980s, Bellow usually addresses his friend with one or another amusing nickname (e.g., "Esteemed Zahar Neoplasmich") and signs in a similar fashion (e.g., "S. B. Pamunyitzoff," "Taras Bulba").

[Samuel Clemens]. Black-and-white photograph of Samuel Clemens seated in rocking chair, smoking a cigar, dated July 22, 1906, and inscribed to a Mrs. Coe on recto and verso; verso inscription reads: "Shall I learn to be good? ... I will sit here & think it over."

Gregory Corso. The only surviving drafts of 88 poems by the Beat poet, from 15 to 144 lines in length, for two unpublished books: *Who Am I—Who I Am* and *Heirlooms for the Future* (a title used for a sound recording about the Beats issued by the Naropa Institute in 1999), written for the most part in 1978–80, though several date from 1975–77. The poems are accompanied by a 3-page typescript from 1980, in which Corso recounts the history of the writing and aborted publication of the books, placing them in a chronological bibliography of his published work. Various drafts of individual poems allow researchers to see how Corso altered the poems over a period of several years.

John Donne. *Poems, by J. D. With Elegies on the Authors Death.* With engraved frontispiece portrait of Donne at age 18, by William Marshall. London: Printed by M[iles] F[letcher] for John Marriott, 1653. This 2nd edition of Donne's *Poems* is important because it contains the first printing of 37 poems and because the poems are arranged chronologically in groups (Songs and Sonnets, Elegies, Satires, etc.), as opposed to the chaotic arrangement of the 1st edition. The 2nd edition is also the first to include the engraving by Marshall (who engraved the famous portrait of Shakespeare in the 1st edition of his *Sonnets*), after an unknown painting.

T. S. Eliot. *Murder in the Cathedral*. London: Faber and Faber, 1935. Inscribed and signed by Eliot to Katherine Stenhouse, a member of the Canterbury Cathedral Chapter House, which first produced the play. Stenhouse was a member of the chorus, and she filled her copy with

annotations regarding line readings, stage directions, and stick figure drawings indicating the grouping of characters on the stage. Since Eliot was involved in all the rehearsals, the production carries at least the implied authority of his intention.

Jack Kerouac. 43 artworks, comprising oil and mixed-media paintings, and drawings.

Vladimir Nabokov. Copies of 4 works by the author, annotated by him and, in two instances, also by his wife, Véra; and a copy of *TriQuarterly*, no. 17:

Dar [The Gift]. [New York: Editions Tchékhov], 1952. 1st edition. With a signed and dated inscription by Nabokov to his son, Dmitri. Autograph annotations on 57 pages, mostly in English, occasionally in Russian, with an eye toward Nabokov's preparation of the first English-language edition. An entire poem (p. 27) is presented here for the first time in its English translation, in Nabokov's hand. The inscription to his son is written in French, Russian, and English, as well as in a language created by Nabokov.

Lolita. London: Transworld Publishers (Corgi Books), 1962. Autograph corrections and annotations on 24 pages, not including the addition of words not in the original text, marginal notes in Russian, and numerous instances of ticking of lines, underlining, and bracketing of words on at least a dozen other pages, whose meanings wait to be deciphered by Nabokov scholars.

*Pale Fire.* New York: Berkley Publishing Corporation (Berkley Medallion Books), 1968. Corrections and underlinings by Nabokov and his wife, Véra, on 50 pages. The first 3 pages contain a list of citations, in Nabokov's hand, to the corrected pages. This copy bears the word "Corrected" on the cover.

Vozvratchenié Tchorba [The Return of Chorb]. Berlin: Slovo, 1930 [1929]. Annotations by Nabokov and his wife, Véra, on 9 pages. The Return of Chorb is a collection of short stories and poems bearing the title of a story that Nabokov published in 1925. The annotations are especially interesting in light of the translation into English by Nabokov and his son, Dmitri, in 1975 of the title story, which appeared in the 1976 collection of such translations, Details of a Sunset and Other Stories.

TriQuarterly, no. 17, Winter 1970. Evanston, Ill., Northwestern University. An issue of the literary magazine devoted entirely to Nabokov, on the occasion of his 70th birthday, containing black-and-white reproductions of the outlines of a butterfly. Vanessa atalanta, two of which Nabokov has hand-colored. Vanessa atalanta, known in the vernacular as "Vulcan" or "Red Admirable," appears indirectly, in Lolita, as the name of a character (Vanessa), and explicitly in his autobiography, Speak Memory, and in Pale Fire ("My dark Vanessa, Crimson-barred, my blest / My Admirable butterfly!").

George Bernard Shaw. Autograph letter, signed with initials, to George Moore, October 25, 1930, at the bottom of a typed letter from Moore to Shaw, in which Shaw comments acidly on Winston Churchill's negative review of one of his plays.

Terry Southern. 10 items, including 4 unpublished letters and 1 unpublished note to Nelson Lyon, his *Candy* collaborator. One of the letters, about the pornographic film version of *Candy*, is composed as a collage; 2 letters discuss in a highly humorous way, respectively, Elaine Kaufman (of the restaurant Elaine's) and Lyon's legal difficulties in regard to a sex scandal; and the last presents outrageous ideas for erotic comedy sketches on *Saturday Night Live*, for which Southern briefly wrote. The note accompanies a satiric broadside by Southern about racial commercialism that he posted on walls throughout Greenwich Village. Also included is a copy of *Screw* magazine annotated by Southern for Lyon's entertainment, and an anonymous pornographic cartoon from a counterculture comic book, also annotated by Southern for Lyon, titled "Chambers and Hiss in Betrayed."

Le jeu du juif. Board game, printed on paper, comprising 12 large squares that have been separated and mounted in an album as a volume of engravings, each plate illustrating a favorite pastime of the ancien régime. France, ca. 1760.

Central American Archive. Microfilm set, based on materials at the Archivo General de Centroamerica in Guatemala, documenting the entire period of Spanish colonial rule in Central America and southern Mexico through letters, legal documents, diplomatic dispatches, confidential communiqués, land surveys, minute books of town meetings, and maps.

Cuban Exile Collection. Microfilm set, based on the Cuban Heritage Collection at the University of Miami, documenting more than 40 years of postrevolutionary Cuban history through newsletters, specialized newspapers, and magazines.

#### **Manuscripts and Archives Division**

Jeff Kisseloff. 411 cassettes of interviews conducted by Kisseloff for three book projects: You Must Remember This: An Oral History of Manhattan from the 1890s to World War II (1989); Generation on Fire: Voices of Protest from the 1960s (2007); and an unfinished project about the integration of Major League baseball in the 1940s.

Lord Byron. Autograph letter, signed, to James Cawthorn, 15 July 1809, [1] p.; mounted on the inner side of a paper wrapper enclosing a manuscript in an unknown hand of Sir Walter Scott's "Remarks on the Death of Lord Byron by Sir Walter Scott," and of Byron's last poem, written at Missolonghi, inscribed by the unknown copyist at the foot of the page and dated December 1827. In the letter, to his publisher, Byron asks to be informed of the publication of the second edition of his *English Bards and Scotch Reviewers*.

Album of letters by women authors including Augusta Leigh, the Ladies of Llangolen, Caroline Norton, Hannah More, Maria Edgeworth, Felicia Hemans, and the Countess of Huntingdon, 1775–1854.





# Financials

### REPORT OF THE TREASURER

The New York Public Library ushered in a fresh era of financial stability as the fiscal year ended June 30, 2007, and the new one began July 1. This good fortune reflects the fruits of three particular Library efforts initiated years ago. Each deserves comment:

- Increased City support—Following steady, focused advocacy efforts by the Library and its supporters, the City of New York committed \$20.1 million of increased operating funds for the year begun July 1, 2007, to enable NYPL to open all its libraries six days per week, a service level not seen since September 11, 2001. The City also committed an additional \$48 million of capital to fund a variety of important facility upgrades. Consistent outreach to a wide range of elected officials coupled with proactive support from tens of thousands of Library supporters all contributed to this funding breakthrough.
- Superior investment results—Thanks to superlative guidance and oversight from the Investment Committee of its Board of Trustees, the Library's endowment has achieved enviable investment returns. Investment returns for the year and five years ended June 30, 2007, were 21.4% and 13.2% respectively. These results place the Library among the top 10% and 25%, respectively, of all endowments and foundations, including the largest, most sophisticated programs. This is unusually tangible evidence of the value of our Trustees' investment acumen.
- Sustainable endowment spending—In 2004, cutbacks in City operating support caused the Library to spend as much as 7.5% of its unrestricted endowment each year on current operations at the expense of keeping pace with inflation longer term. In order to bring endowment spending down to a sustainable level, the Library's Trustees adopted a four-year plan to reduce the endowment spending rate from 7.5% to 5% over four years. Although it was painful to ratchet down spending levels, the Library has achieved the 5% spending level for the year begun July 1, 2007, and can be proud that its endowment will be able to provide consistent, growing operating support to the Library for decades to come.

Despite these superb achievements, several challenges remain. First, although the increased City support is excellent—and it has been "baselined," which means it is less at risk of rollback—City support still depends on the health of the City's finances. New York City's economy—and thus its tax base—is particularly dependent on two industries: financial services and real estate. Both were hit hard by the subprime crisis of July–August, so we must be mindful that ongoing City support is subject to risk.

Second, the Library's deferred maintenance needs, which we have chronicled previously, remain. In addition to buildings that demand renovation and modernization, the Library's information technology equipment requires constant replacement and upgrading.

### **Financial Plan and Outlook**

The Library is well along in developing a multiyear financial plan to address its challenges. While all the specifics have not been delineated, some of the major elements are clear:

- New gifts—The Library is beginning to contemplate a sizeable campaign to attract major new resources.
- Sale of assets not critical to mission—The Library sold art works so that the proceeds could be reinvested in collections spending, and other non-core assets are being reviewed.
- Continued discipline and vigilance regarding expenditures—This will involve a constant process of finding smarter, more efficient ways to do things.

The Library remains fiscally sound, but prudent management requires us to plan for the future, as we evolve, to assure that we leave a legacy of financial strength for generations to come.

The Library is an organization that is vital to the people of New York City and State, and to the information community worldwide. The City and State governments, Board of Trustees, Library management, and staff remain committed to the extraordinary and historic public-private partnership that has made The New York Public Library one of the world's greatest libraries.





# FIGURE 1 The Branch Libraries: Operating Support and Revenue (\$158,711,000)





# FIGURE 2 The Research Libraries and Librarywide Programs: Operating Support and Revenue (\$144,255,000)







Market Values as of June 30



### RECOMMENDED FORM OF BEQUEST

The New York Public Library is a not-for-profit education corporation incorporated under the laws of the State of New York. The Library is exempt from federal income tax as an organization described in section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and is a publicly supported organization under section 170 of the Code.

Gifts and bequests to the Library are deductible under the federal income, estate, and gift tax laws. For federal tax purposes, the Library uses its formal corporate name: The New York Public Library, Astor, Lenox and Tilden Foundations (reflecting its incorporation by the consolidation of the Astor Library, the Lenox Library, and the Tilden Trust). The Trustees of the Library recommend that for estate planning purposes, friends consider the following language for use in their Wills:

"I give and bequeath (dollar amount, percentage of residuary estate, or description of property) to The New York Public Library, Astor, Lenox and Tilden Foundations, Fifth Avenue and 42nd Street, New York, New York 10018, for the Library's general purposes."

If you wish to make a bequest for a specific purpose, it is suggested that you consider adding the following language to any restriction you may impose on your bequest:

"If at any time in the judgment of the Trustees of the Library the designated purpose of this bequest proves to be impracticable or impossible, I authorize the Trustees to use the income and principal of this bequest for any purpose they deem to be consistent with the general intent and purpose set forth herein."

Should you decide to leave a bequest to the Library in your Will, you will become a member of the Bigelow Society. Created by the Library in 1991, the Bigelow Society is an honorary organization whose purpose is to recognize the generosity of individuals, during their lifetime, who include this institution in their estate plans. The Library expresses its gratitude to members by inviting them to special Library events and by listing their names in the Annual Report under the Bigelow Society (see pages 77–82).
